A Christian of the first century or so would have been hard-pressed to understand what we mean by a feast day or holy day. That person would have understood Sunday as the primary feast day, and Easter as the primary Sunday. It was only over time that the Church began to set aside particular days and seasons to commemorate certain events or highlight selected mysteries of the faith. What has evolved over the centuries is a "map" of our faith, written on the days and seasons of the year. Some have observed that one will absorb all the major teachings of the Church in the course of a single year of Sundays if one is attentive. What a wonderful way to get Christianity "into our bones!" And best of all, there are no grades!

From the Desk of Fr. Brian Hayes, Pastor**September 9, 2012****23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time****Year of Faith**

On October 11, 2012, the fiftieth anniversary of the opening of the Second Vatican Council, Pope Benedict XVI will proclaim a *Year of Faith*. What will this mean for Catholics the world over? We are being called to a year of prayer, study, outreach, and evangelization so that the name of Jesus will be known and loved throughout the world. Let's consider some of what the Holy Father has in mind for this special Year. In his Apostolic letter entitled *Porto Fidei* (The Door of Faith) he makes these points: The "door of faith" (Acts 14:27) is always open to us, ushering us into a life of unity with God and offering entry into his Church. People cross that threshold when the word of God is proclaimed and the heart allows itself to be shaped by transforming grace. To enter through that door is to set out on a lifelong journey of faith.

This *Year of Faith* will be a good opportunity for the whole Church to enter into a time of particular reflection and rediscovery of the faith.

The launch of the *Year of Faith* to coincide with the anniversary of the Second Vatican Council will provide opportunities to help people understand the texts of the Council Fathers, which in the words of Blessed John Paul II, "have lost nothing of their value or brilliance." They need to be read correctly, widely known and taken to heart as important texts in the teaching of Church Tradition.

The *Year of Faith* is a summons to an authentic and renewed conversion to the Lord.

Today, as in the past, Christ sends us out to the highways and hedgerows (Luke 14:23) of the world to proclaim his Gospel to all the peoples of the earth. We want to help everyone be able to speak about his or her faith when appropriate. This is also a time to renew our love for the liturgy, especially the Eucharist.

We also want everyone to rediscover and profess our basic catholic beliefs, to celebrate, live, and pray them. St. Luke teaches that knowing the content to be believed is not enough unless the heart, the sacred space within us, is opened by grace that allows the eyes to see below the surface and understand that what has been proclaimed is the work of God (Acts 16:14)

Our faith is not a purely private matter. Our faith is both personal and communal. We should come together with each other in our parishes in order to achieve these goals.

During this *Year of Faith* should be a time to intensify the witness of caring for those who are vulnerable, hungry, and in need of justice. Faith without charity bears no fruit. Through faith, we can recognize the face of the risen Lord in those who ask for our love. "As you did it to one of the least of these who are member of my family, you did it to me" (Mt 25:40) At Holy Trinity during this Year of Faith, we will be offering opportunities to study the Vatican Council documents, continuing Bible Study, and vibrant liturgies that will help to grow in our faith both individually and as a Community, and in stronger outreach. May this year of faith make our relationship with Christ the Lord increasingly firm. Let us entrust this time of grace to Mary, Mother of God, about whom we say, "Blessed is she who believed" (Luke 1:445).

Holy Trinity School Opening Mass This past Tuesday we had a wonderful opening-of-the-school-year Mass with auxiliary/coadjutor Bishop Cirilo Flores. Bishop Flores was very friendly and gracious, encouraging all present to believe and trust in the love of God for them and to make the most of the opportunity provided by our school to grow in their catholic faith.

Immediately following the Mass, we processed out to the school soccer field for the blessing of the new stations of the cross. These stations were designed and built by parishioner Robert Sporleder (with help from his family members and others) as one of his boy scout projects. We thank and commend Robert for his great work and dedication to serving others as a boy scout and Catholic member of society, and especially of our parish/school community.

Church Remodel—New Plan!

Thanks to our secret benefactor and his architect, we now have a brand new draft-plan to remodel the church bathrooms and gathering area... but instead of remodeling the existing area as initially planned, it involves creating a whole new addition to the west side of the church, which, as you know, is where most of the people enter the church.
